

Rooms 3, 4 and 8 have been learning using a creative online curriculum scheduled through Seesaw. This learning is transformative and allows for freedom of creativity, autonomy and expression. Some of the highlights include Wilderness Explorer

activities, created by Miss R in room 4, based on the Pixar film UP. This unit encompasses a range of subjects including HASS, English, Science and Visual Arts and allows students to engage in self-paced learning based on interest. Additionally, the Poetry unit was sequenced and segmented into bite sized learning portions which allowed students to build on their learning piece by piece.
